

Fill the sets you actually want

Choose one set type, confirm real openings and make the first set easy to book on a phone.

Type in the fields or print. Save your copy; keep client details in your normal business system. Sensitivity, suitability and fill timing are the lash artist's professional call.

1 Choose a service and confirm capacity

Count full blocks inside each uninterrupted opening. Shorter gaps can go to fills but will not fit a new full set. Keep fill time reserved for existing clients.

Look at your profile and booking page as a stranger would, on a phone.

2 Check the portfolio and first-set page

- ☐ Photos are your own work, well lit, from consistent angles.
- ☐ Style names in photos match the booking menu.
- ☐ First-set length, preparation, fill policy and cancellation terms are visible.
- ☐ Visitors can ask a question; sensitivity questions go to the artist.

3 Improve one way nearby clients find you

A useful reply to a first-set question, with real times offered

Plan the first fill and review

Four weeks is a planning period, not a promised result. Keep following fills after it ends.

Count each person once per stage. A booked fill is not an attended fill; keep new and returning clients separate.
